First Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21

Isaiah portrays a time when people from many nations will gather in Jerusalem and proclaim God's glory. God's messengers will teach many nations about God. Just as the Israelites bring offerings, these messengers will bring people from all nations to worship.

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

The Hebrews are told that God disciplines those he loves. When a parent disciplines a child, the child usually learns what is expected of him. The Hebrews are encouraged to face life's trials as a form of discipline, and attempt to learn something from them.

Jesus warns that the door to God's kingdom will be locked for those who ignored his wishes. Many people will come from all nations and take their place in God's kingdom. Others will not be recognized by God, and he will reject them.

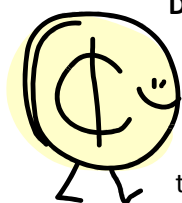

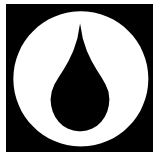

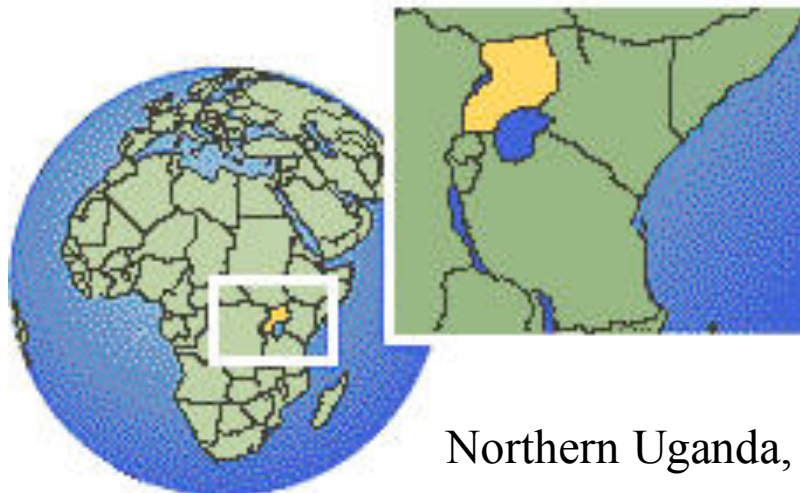

Paterson Diocese Missionary Cooperation Plan-

August 28-29, 2010

Archdiocese of Gulu



Northern Uganda, Africa

Next weekend, Father Michael Lomakec, will be speaking at the Masses in our parish on behalf of Archbishop John Baptist Odama of Gulu, the largest diocese in Uganda. The diocese has 25 parishes; and each parish has at least 10 mission churches. From 1986 to 2008 the Archdiocese was seriously affected by the war in northern Uganda and the southern Sudan. The archdiocese was caught in the middle of the conflict, and lost thousands of lives and property during those 22 years. Thousands of archdiocese's parishioners are still in refugee camps in their own country and they depend on the relief food and other essential items organized for them by the missionaries in that region [because the government for many years did not succeed fully to the lives and property of the people]. It is difficult to preach the Good News of salvation to a suffering faithful without practically reaching out to them and trying to solve some of their urgent and basic needs. We are asked for our prayers and financial support through this year's mission appeal in our parish.
