

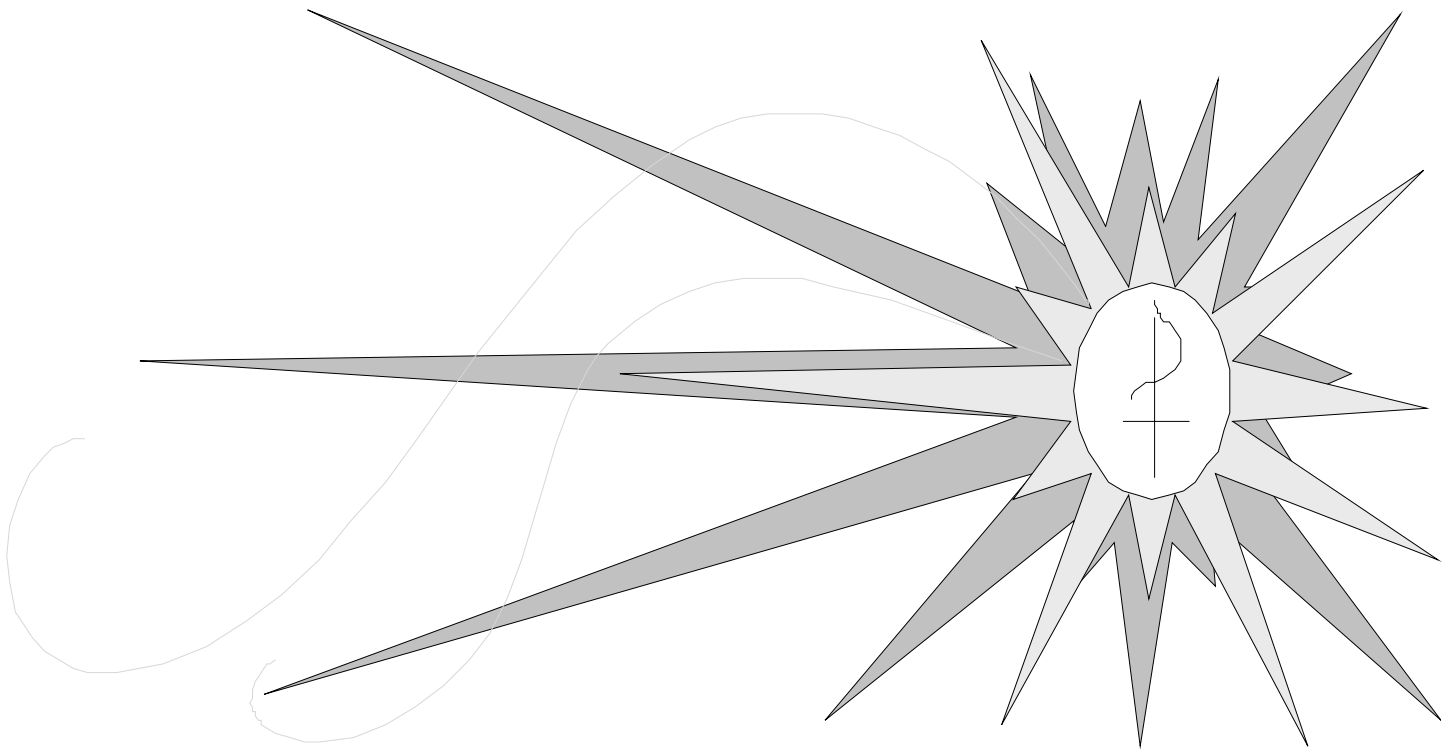

33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME ✠ NOVEMBER 14, 2010

First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20a

The prophet Malachi warned that the time would come when all the evil people would be punished. He then speaks of the arrival of "the sun of justice, with its healing rays," believed by most to mean Jesus.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Some of the Thessalonians claimed Christ's return was imminent, so they stopped working and asked others for food. Paul describes his willingness to work, so that he would not impose on others. He encourages them to follow his example and earn their own living.

Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

Jesus warns of the persecution all Christians will face because of him, and how some will even be put to death. Yet he says they will not be harmed because "by patient endurance you will save your lives." If Jesus' followers are loyal, they will be resurrected and their suffering will end.

KNIGHTLY NEWS

Knights defend Pledge of Allegiance once again...



The Knights of Columbus continued its bi-coastal legal defense of the words "under God" in the Pledge of Allegiance during oral arguments before the First U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Boston on September 9. The Order also filed written arguments. Brother Knight Kevin Hasson, President of The Becket Fund for Religious Liberty, a public interest law firm in Washington, D.C., once again represented the Order in oral arguments before an appellate court panel, as he had in San Francisco in November 2007 before a panel of the Ninth Circuit. The Knights of Columbus won the California case in March 2010. In each case, the Knights of Columbus asked the court to become a "defendant intervenor," allowing the Order to participate directly as a party to the case, rather than simply filing a "friend of the court" brief. The East Coast lawsuit, Freedom from Religion Foundation v. United States, had been filed in federal district court in New Hampshire in 2007. The Knights of Columbus scored a victory when the New Hampshire district court ruled that the Pledge was constitutional in 2009, and the Freedom from Religion Foundation appealed the decision. Atheist Michael Newdow, the attorney in both the California and New Hampshire cases, appealed the New Hampshire case and is asking the Ninth Circuit for a rehearing by the full appeals court.

STEWARDSHIP SAINT FOR NOVEMBER

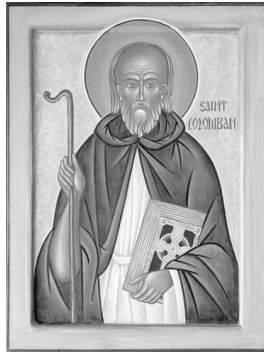
Saint Columban

The life of Saint Columban (also referred to as Columbanus) reveals a man who exercised remarkable stewardship over his life of faith and his gifts for evangelizing.

He was born into a noble family in West Leinster, Ireland, in about 543; a time when the great Celtic monasteries were being established in Ireland. He received a classical education and as a young man became attracted to the monastic practice of integrating prayer, manual labor and study of the scriptures into one's daily life. He entered the renowned monastery of Bangor and for many years embraced a life of asceticism. In mid-life, he believed he was being called by God to preach the Gospel in foreign countries. He responded to this call, becoming one of the great Irish missionary saints. He established a number of monasteries in present-day France and Italy including the famous monastic community at Luxeuil in France, where he served as abbot for more than 20 years.

His feast day is November 23.
