*Choose***First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20**

This passage from Sirach gives strong, unequivocal emphasis to free will in every person. Before each of us is set, sin or virtue, life or death, and each of us are free to choose the one or the other.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Paul explains to the Corinthians that there are two different kinds of wisdom — the wisdom of God and the wisdom of the world. The wisdom of God is mysterious, but this wisdom has been revealed “to those who love him” through the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people he has come to fulfill the law. He speaks strongly against murder and anger, against adultery and lust, and against false oaths and lies. He warns the people that unless their virtue exceeds that of the Pharisees, they “will not enter the kingdom of God.”

KNIGHTLY NEWS



FEDERAL CIRCUIT COURT UPHOLDS PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE LAW

For the second time in one year, a federal appellate court rejected a constitutional challenge to the Pledge of Allegiance. On Nov. 12, 2010, the First U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, in Boston, affirmed a lower court decision, New Hampshire, dismissing a challenge by the Freedom from Religion Foundation.

As in an earlier Pledge case, in California, the Knights of Columbus joined the case as a "defendant intervenor" and was represented by the Becket Fund for Religious Liberty. The Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals upheld the constitutionality of the Pledge.

In its decision in Freedom from Religion Foundation vs Hanover School District, the First Circuit held that a New Hampshire Law requiring that public schools provide a period for the voluntary recitation of the Pledge, does not violate the U.S. Constitution.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, part of his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus does not speak of replacing the law of the Old Testament. He goes beyond it. He obliges his followers to work at being holier than even the strictest of Pharisees. But the work is not accomplished by following a religious "law", it requires growing in love for other human beings. Followers of Jesus know they are required to be good stewards of others.

In what way will you exercise good stewardship over other people this week?

STEWARDSHIP SAINT

Saint Angela Merici

Angela brought together a group of unmarried women who went out into the streets to gather up the girls they saw to teach them and offer religious instruction in their homes. These women had little money, but were bound together by their dedication to education and commitment to serving Jesus Christ. She would remind her group that they had a greater need to serve the poor than the poor had of their service. She embraced a prayerful and simple lifestyle.

Angela's group was so successful that Angela was asked to bring her innovative approach to educating young women to other cities. Her ministry impressed many, and was brought to the attention of Pope Clement VII.

In 1535, Angela Merici chose twelve young women and formally started the Company of Saint Ursula in a small house in Brescia. Although it was never a recognized religious order in her lifetime, Angela's Company of Saint Ursula, or the Ursuline nuns, was the first group of women religious to work outside of a cloister and the first teaching order of women.

Among some of the last pieces of advice she gave her fellow sisters was a stewardship message: that they should do in life what they would have wanted to do in death. She died on 27 January 1540 at seventy years of age. Her feast day is January 27.
