Prosthetic Limbs Shipped To Haiti's Children

Project Medishare and Knights of Columbus provide "hope for Haiti's children" with a shipment to Port-au-Prince. Just three months after Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson announced the Order would donate \$1 million to Project Medishare to provide prostheses to Haitian children who lost their limbs in the January 2010 earthquake, a large shipment was sent.

An estimated 1000 children underwent amputations after suffering severe injuries in the earthquake. Project Medishare, which operates a critical care, trauma and rehabilitation hospital, as well as clinics, is equipped to fit prostheses and to provide physical therapy once patients have been fitted with the devices. The Knights of Columbus agreed to underwrite the cost of both the prostheses and the therapy for children who needed them. The children will be supplied up to three prostheses (as they outgrow them) and two years of physical therapy.

Next Sunday, Feb. 6th The Boy Scouts of America celebrate their founding. Scouts should be in uniform and attend the 9am Mass.

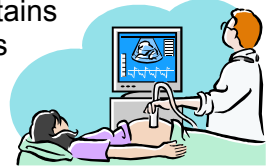


RESPECT LIFE

Spiritual Adoption Update: Month Four

Your baby is quite active in the womb now—although his/her mother won't feel him/her for another couple of months. If his/her mother's womb had a window, you could watch your spiritually adopted baby squint, swallow and move his/her tongue. He/she can make a tight fist if you touch his/her palm. He/she is breathing fluid which continues until birth. He/she obtains the oxygen his/her body needs through the umbilical cord. The baby you are praying for weighs one ounce.

Students must be 3-years old by October 1, 2011, for Pre-School and 4-years old by October 1, 2011, for Pre-Kindergarten and must be toilet trained. Students registering for Kindergarten must be 5-years old by October 1, 2011. Extended day is available at an extra charge.
