



THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Exodus 17:3-7

This story from Exodus reveals that the Israelites, after their escape from Egypt, cast all blame for their sufferings on Moses. In this instance, they were dying of thirst. When Moses appealed to the Lord, the Lord directed Moses to strike a rock and water would gush forth.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

Paul reminds the Romans that because Christ died for all people, they are acceptable in God's sight.

Gospel: John 4:5-42

Jesus converses with the Samaritan woman at Jacob's Well. When Jesus indicates that whoever drinks from the water He gives will never be thirsty again, the woman immediately answers, "Give me this water, sir...". Jesus then reveals that she has had five husbands and tells her that He is the Messiah. The woman believes Jesus and proclaims this news to all the townspeople, who believe her and come to see Jesus.

– On **Monday, April 4**, St. Paul Inside the Walls will host the Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Speaker Tour – *Behold: Peace in the Holy Land – The Parents Circle-Families Forum*. In this special engagement, Dr. Omar Al-Alool, a Palestinian, and Mr. Yuval Rahamim, an Israeli, will each speak of their own and their families’ experiences with violence in the Middle East, their own personal metanoia, embracing peace, and forgiveness and reconciliation, along with the work of the Parents Circle-Families Forum, a group of Israelis and Palestinians who believe in peace, nonviolence and reconciliation and who are working to stop the bloodshed and violence between their people. **Their presentation begins, following 7:00pm Mass, at 7:30pm.**

POPE BENEDICT XVI MESSAGE FOR LENT

“You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him.” (cf. Col 2: 12)

The question that Jesus puts to the Samaritan woman: “Give me a drink” (Jn 4: 7), is presented to us in the liturgy of the third Sunday; it expresses the passion of God for every man and woman, and wishes to awaken in our hearts the desire for the gift of “a spring of water within, welling up for eternal life” (Jn 4: 14): this is the gift of the Holy Spirit, who transforms Christians into “true worshipers,” capable of praying to the Father “in spirit and truth” (Jn 4: 23). Only this water can extinguish our thirst for goodness, truth and beauty! Only this water, given to us by the Son, can irrigate the deserts of our restless and unsatisfied soul, until it “finds rest in God”, as per the famous words of St. Augustine.
