Paul points out to the Corinthians that through the sharing of the cup and the breaking of the bread, they are all one in Christ Jesus.

After Jesus feeds the five thousand people with barley loaves and fishes, he tries to make them understand the significance and the meaning of what he has done. He tells them, in mysterious and beautiful words, that the bread he gives is his flesh and says, "I myself am the living bread ... If anyone eats this bread, he shall live forever."

A New Translation of the Roman Missal

A CONTINUING COLUMN

The Links between the *Rituals and Prayers of the Mass* with the texts of *Scripture*

One of the goals of the new translation of the Roman Missal was to make clearer the links between the rituals and prayers of the Mass with the texts of Scripture. Scripture is one key to unlocking the meaning of these rituals and prayers. The entire Mass is full of biblical references. The Bible calls out to us in so many of the prayers, signs, and rituals of the Mass. Candles, incense, standing, kneeling, phrases such as "The Lord be with you," and "Glory to God in the highest"... all have their roots in Sacred Scripture, either directly or indirectly. Knowing the biblical background of the prayers and rites of the Mass sheds much light on what is actually happening in the Liturgy. It will enhance our participation in it, and enable us to enter more deeply into the mystery of the Mass. Dr. Edward Sri, a professor of theology and Scripture at the Augustine Institute, gives these examples:

"The prayer 'Glory to God in the highest,' which echoes the angels' song over Bethlehem on the first Christmas, helps us see that just as the angelic hosts welcomed Jesus with this hymn some 2,000 years ago, so also do we prepare to welcome Our Lord on our altars in the Eucharist when we sing or recite this prayer at Sunday Mass. Similarly, when the celebrant washes his hands before the Eucharistic Prayer, this recalls a similar rite performed by the Old Testament priests before approaching God's presence in the sanctuary. When we see this ceremonial hand-washing at Mass, we should be in awe, since, from a biblical perspective, this signals that the priest is approaching the holy presence of God and will offer the most sacred of all sacrifices as Christ makes his sacrifice on the cross present in the Eucharist through the priest."

They walked in tandem, each of the ninety-two students filing into the already crowded auditorium. With their rich maroon gowns flowing and the traditional caps, they looked almost as grown up as they felt.

Dads swallowed hard behind broad smiles, and Moms freely brushed away tears.

This class would NOT pray during the commencements, not by choice, but because of a recent court ruling prohibiting it.

The principal and several students were careful to stay within the guidelines allowed by the ruling. They gave inspirational and challenging speeches, but no one mentioned divine guidance and no one asked for blessings on the graduates or their families.

The speeches were nice, but they were routine until the final speech received a standing ovation.

A solitary student walked proudly to the microphone. He stood still and silent for just a moment, and then, it happened.

All 92 students, every single one of them, suddenly **SNEEZED !!!!**

The student on stage simply looked at the audience and said, **'GOD BLESS YOU'**

And he walked off the stage...

The audience exploded into applause. This graduating class had found a unique way to invoke God's blessing on their future with or without the court's approval.
