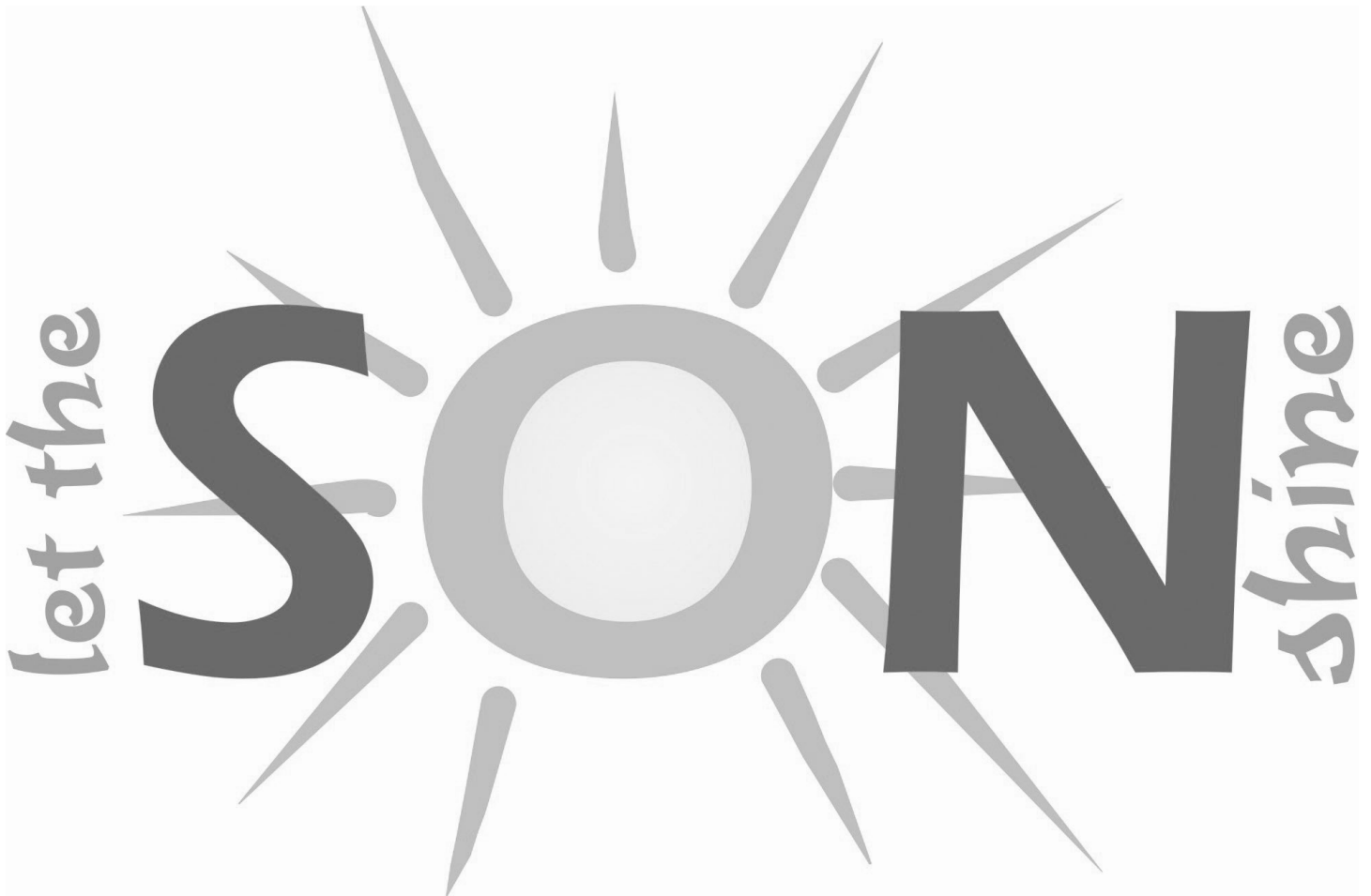

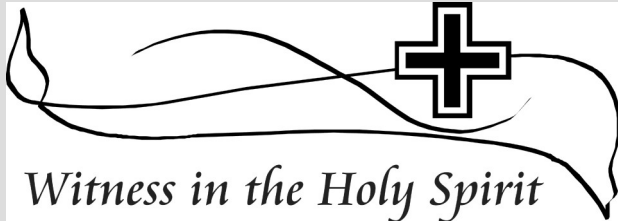

Witness in the Holy Spirit

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a

After fleeing from the revenge of the King of Israel, Elijah hid in a cave, but at the command of God, he went outside and stood on a mountain. There the Lord came to him, not in the wind nor in the earthquake, but in a "tiny whispering sound."

Second Reading: Romans 9:1-5

Paul is deeply pained because the Jews - in spite of everything that has been given to them - have rejected Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

Matthew vividly recounts the event of Jesus walking on the water. When the disciples see this, they are terrified, and Jesus chastises them for their fear. Peter begs Christ to let him walk on the water; he is at first brave but begins to sink and loses faith, crying out, "Lord save me!" Christ rescues him for his faltering faith.

The Gloria ("Glory to God in the Highest...")

In our Introductory Rites, we now shift from sorrowful repentance to joyful praise as we pray the "Gloria", whose opening line is taken from the words sung by the angels announcing the news of Jesus' birth. In the "Kyrie", we expressed our need for salvation - God's mercy. In the "Gloria", we joyfully express our gratitude for having received salvation from Christ. Then, showing that we are meeting God in prayer, we go on to praise the Trinity - to thank God for being great and glorious, to thank the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, and to acknowledge the Church gathered together with them in the Holy Spirit. With all the added scriptural titles* in the *Gloria*, we now encounter these three divine Persons more intimately.

Lectors

TRAINING PROVIDED

Members of the Ministry of Lectors proclaim the Word of God at all liturgical functions of the parish.

- **What is required to become a part of this ministry?**
Availability (scheduled), ability to proclaim well publicly, an appreciation of the written Word of God, good grooming, and appropriate attire
- **Who can participate in this ministry?**
Any confirmed practicing Catholic, usually sophomore in high school and up. You will receive a practical session (to assess ability to read publicly and to give public speaking tools if needed).
- **What is the time commitment?**
Usually about once a month on a Saturday evening or Sunday morning, plus prep time of going over the readings at home. Lectors must arrive fifteen minutes before Mass to pray the lectors' prayer, to make sure that the lectionary and lector's binder are in order, and to familiarize themselves with the Prayers of the Faithful. Confession twice annually and availability for extraordinary liturgies would also be required.

"Then the Lord said to him, 'Go outside and stand on the mountain before the Lord, the Lord will be passing by.' A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountains and crushing rocks before the Lord – but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake there was a fire – but the Lord was not in the fire. After the fire there was a tiny whispering sound. When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave.... 'Lord if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.'"

Our lives have been deeply impacted by the ravages of mother nature. Earthquakes in Haiti, Chile and Japan. Tsunamis in the Pacific rim. Nuclear reactors to be cooled. Wild fires in both east and west. Where is the Lord in all this?

The nonbeliever taunts and questions because of the merciless ravaging events. The faith filled person follows Elijah's and Peter's lead, to hear the voice of the Lord, and follow His call. The former hid his face acknowledging God's special presence. Peter bravely challenged Christ, but when his gaze turned to the wind and waves, he began to sink, then cried out in desperation.

Like Jesus who went apart, alone, to pray, pause for a minute. Remember the countless victims of the natural disasters, as well as human forged disasters. Like Peter, call to the Lord in need, and reach for His extended arm. Like a child trusting that a loving father quiet, gentle presence of the Lord is
