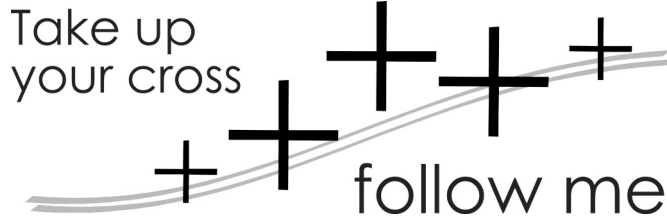

### TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Jeremiah 20:7-9

In this particularly poetic passage, Jeremiah complains that while teaching the Lord's word, he is subjected to insults and derision. He determines to remain silent, but he cannot because the desire to speak the Lord's name is "like a fire burning in my heart."

#### Second Reading: Romans 12:1-2

Paul tells the Christians to make sacrifices to avoid the trappings of the times, and to do God's will.

#### Gospel: Matthew 16:21-27

Jesus tries to make his disciples realize that by following him, they will endure suffering, degradation, and death. He tells them that they must deny themselves and take up the cross in order to be his disciples.

## STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus brings up the topic of the cross to his followers. They would not realize the cross was part of God's plan and was to be their legacy until after the Resurrection. Today's followers of Christ recognize they are stewards of his entire legacy, including his cross; that through their mutual sacrifices God's glory is revealed. They don't live their life in Christ only when it is convenient for them. They make a decision to take up their cross and carry it, no matter what the cost. **What crosses do we bear in order to reveal God's glory?**

## RESPECT LIFE

The life of Dr. Bernard Nathanson reminds us that change is always possible, even profound change. Science prompted him to publicly profess in 1974 that as director of "the largest abortion clinic in the Western world," I had "in fact presided over 60,000 deaths." He presented that reality in his film, "The Silent Scream" that captured the image of an unborn child shrinking from the surgical instruments of an abortionist, an image that Nathanson called, "the silent scream of a child threatened imminently with extinction."

Relationships live in a careful balance. If a person changes, the balance is altered requiring a shift in the relationship. In today's gospel Jesus announced a change and Peter resisted. Sometimes, those we count on for support may actually get in the way. Jesus told Peter: "You are an obstacle to me."



## A New Translation of the Roman Missal

A CONTINUING COLUMN

**Nicene Creed: "The Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages."**

Even before there was such a thing as time, Jesus is begotten and born of the Father. Jesus is "before all things", says Saint Paul. (Col.1:17) "I am the first and the last." Jesus said in the Book of Revelation, "the one who lives." (Rev.1:17-18) Jesus didn't just appear all of a sudden as the Son of God. Jesus dwelled with the Father before time began. His presence has always been part of God's plan. Jesus is **only begotten, born of the Father before all ages.**

And Jesus is also **consubstantial** (of the same substance) with the Father. Jesus is the eternal Son of God, equal to the Father. Jesus is a distinct divine Person who has existed from all eternity sharing the same divine nature with the Father and the Holy Spirit. This is why Jesus said to His Apostle Philip: "whoever has seen me has seen the Father...Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me?" (Jn14:9-10) Jesus is not like anything or anyone else.

**Next week: Jesus is "Incarnate", "suffered death", "in accordance with the Scriptures"**
