A CONTINUING COLUMN

The Profession of Faith: the Creed begins with "I" instead of "We"

Our profession of faith stays the same; but our words of profession will change. There will be more changed words in this prayer than in any of the other prayers said by all of us together at Mass.

"I believe" instead of "we believe". The Creed is still the faith of the entire Church, but it is not enough to say what Christians believe in general. Rather, it is what "I believe", to what I give the acceptance of my heart and mind and soul. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains, "I believe" expresses "the faith of the Church professed personally by each believer." It is important to personally express our beliefs. If we do not, we can run the risk of taking what is priceless for granted.

"...of all things visible and invisible." When we say these words, we proclaim the truth that what we can see around us is only a small portion of all that is. We believe that God is the maker not only of things we cannot see for whatever reason, but also of things that are in fact invisible --- for example, the saints and angels. And with Saint Paul in his hymn to Christ, we believe Christ "is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in Him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominations or principalities or powers; all things were created through Him and for Him." [Col.1:15-16]

Next week: Our Lord Jesus Christ, "the Only Begotten...born of the Father before all ages."
