### TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Isaiah 55:6-9

Isaiah expresses an urgent plea that all should seek the Lord and turn to him for mercy.

#### Second Reading: Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a

In a strongly personal message from Paul while in prison, he says that he wishes "to be freed from this life and to be with Christ," but he realizes that he still has much important work to do.

#### Gospel: Matthew 20:1-16a

Jesus tells the parable of the owner of an estate who hires workmen for his vineyard. When, at the end of the day, he pays a full day's wage to those who worked only one hour, those who worked all day complained bitterly. But the owner says, "I am free to do as I please, am I not?" Jesus reminds us through this parable that "the last shall be first and the first shall be last."

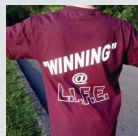

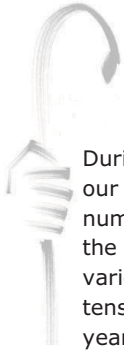

### STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

Christian stewards acknowledge, with humility, that they receive good things from the Lord in abundance; even if these gifts are not the ones they think they need when they need them. Consider which servants you identify with most in the Gospel reading, the ones who demand "fairness", or that final servant who, seemingly, deserves the least.

#### The Eucharistic Prayer - the Preface Dialogue: **It is right and just. Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of Hosts.**

It is **right** and worthy to thank God. It is also **just**. We owe God a debt of gratitude for all things in heaven and on earth. Thanksgiving is the only thing we can actually offer to God that He doesn't already have; so we follow the biblical tradition of offering psalms and prayers of thanksgiving. In our Eucharistic Prayer we will now especially thank God for sending His Son to save us from the Evil One. Jesus' saving Death and Resurrection is about to be made present to us. Our Lord will soon be with us in the Real Presence of the Eucharist. We humbly express our gratitude. It is the only fitting response to the mysteries about to be set forth before us.

We also then, as the prophet Isaiah in his great vision of the heavenly table wrote, join with all those who adore God unceasingly. These angels who minister about God's altar, guard us in our weakness, or fight on our behalf. They and the saints are one in the Church Triumphant, against whose assault, says Jesus, the gates of hell shall not prevail. [Mt 16:18] Indeed "holy is the Lord of **hosts**." [Is 6:13]

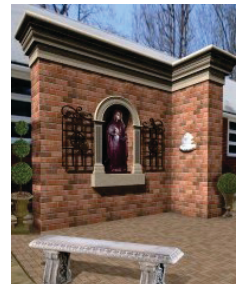

**A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS  
HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly

**"Seek the Lord, while he may be found, call him while he is near. Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked his thoughts; let him turn to the Lord for mercy; to our God who is generous in forgiving"... "conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ."  
"Are you envious because I am generous?"**

Two special words in scripture should really move us. They are mercy and generosity. Both are characteristics of our God, yet often overlooked. Because the Lord is full of mercy and rich in kindness, we do not need to try to convince Him to shower these gifts upon us. All we need to do is acknowledge that these are God's gifts to us for the asking. I do not have to try to convince God to pour out His gifts on me.

Isaiah tells us to be like the children – seek the Lord. We are to move in His direction, and when we do we find that He already is with us, waiting for us to call. If I acknowledge that He is merciful and generous in forgiving, then why wait to seek these special gifts He has for me, and for everyone. The sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation are great signs of these gifts.

God's goodness can be multiplied as I live as a more generous and forgiving person. He may be using me to touch the heart of someone else who is waiting, hurting or searching and feels God is so distant. They couldn't be further from the truth.
