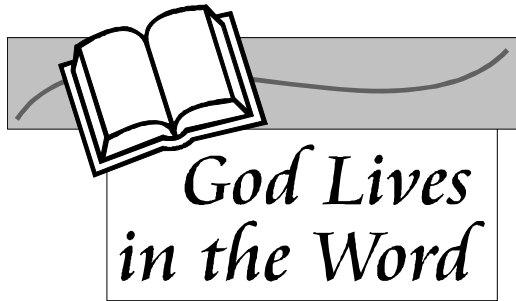

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Exodus 22:20-26

This passage from the book of Exodus enjoins all to adhere to specific religious and social laws. It urges all to act with justice and compassion towards others.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10

Paul praises the Thessalonians for receiving the word of God so eagerly and totally. Word of their faithfulness has spread throughout Macedonia and Greece; they have become a model for all Christians.

Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40

Matthew recounts the incident in which a lawyer, seeking to entrap Jesus, asks, "Teacher, which commandment of the law is the greatest?" With simplicity and authority, Jesus responds that the first commandment is to love God with one's entire being; the second is to love one's neighbor as oneself.

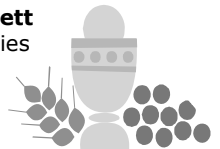

A CONTINUING COLUMN

The Concluding Rites: "Go Forth the Mass is Ended"

We have celebrated the entire paschal mystery of Jesus' passion death and resurrection in our Eucharistic liturgy so that we can be more deeply united to Jesus' life and mission. The closing words of the Mass are a dismissal with a mission, a sending forth of God's people to bring the mysteries of Christ into the world. After the *Prayer After Communion* and brief announcements, the priest greets and blesses the people, and then the people leave "on a mission to extend the Sacrifice of the Word in the world." There are a choice of four dismissals: **"Go forth, the Mass is ended," "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord," "go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life,"** or just **"Go in peace."** We can now end Mass with praise, those words we say when we experience rejoicing or relief, surprise or delight: *"Thanks be to God."* So now, as this person writes: "the ending of Mass is the beginning of a transformed life of "living sacrifice: **Go!"**

RESPECT LIFE

A New Spiritual Adoption Campaign

As we have done several times in the past, we have launched a new nine-month campaign to save individual babies' lives with the minimum effort of brief daily prayer. Participants pledge to say a prayer every day for one particular baby (whom they will name and who probably is unknown to them) who is in danger of being aborted, and for the baby's parents who are facing some difficulty in accepting the new challenge of an unplanned pregnancy.



At each entrance to our church there are baskets of blue commitment cards that give details of the process. The cards also have a sample prayer, although you may say any prayer you wish for this purpose. Please sign and return the pledge card to a basket on a future visit. In the next life God may bless you with the happiness of meeting the person whose life you saved with so little effort but great compassion.

This is a beautiful way to grow in faith by praying together as a family. It is an opportunity to teach children the importance of respecting the life of an unborn baby.

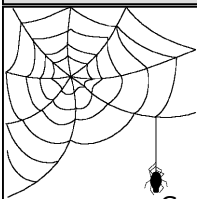
